SECTION 5

DETECTION AND PREVENTION OF ACCEPTANCE OF PROHIBITED WASTE (30 TAC §330.203)

5.1 PROHIBITED WASTE

The following wastes are prohibited for acceptance at the facility, which include waste, as defined in 30 TAC §330.15(e) and other specific waste not accepted at the discretion of Republic:

- Regulated hazardous wastes,
- Class 1 industrial solid waste,
- Wastes containing PCBs,
- Radioactive materials, as defined in Chapter 336 of TCEQ regulations,
- Regulated Asbestos Containing Materials (RACM),
- Infectious and untreated medical waste from healthcare facilities, requiring a shipping document in accordance with §330.1211,
- Containers holding liquid waste, except as provided in §330.15(e)(6)(B),
- Lead-acid batteries,
- Used-oil filters, except as provided under §330.171,
- Do-it-yourself used motor vehicle oil,
- Whole used or scrap tires,
- CFC compounds or large items or white goods containing CFCs, ~~and~~
- Wastes with free liquids, including unstabilized sludge, (as determined by the paint filter test), and
- Slaughterhouse waste.

5.2 DETECTION AND EXCLUSION PROGRAM

In order to address the detection and prevention of regulated hazardous wastes as defined in 40 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Part 261, polychlorinated biphenyls (PCB) wastes as defined
